

Welcome to First Baptist Church of Asheville. Today is the Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The season of Ordinary Time refers to the Sundays of the year that fall outside the periods of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. The word Ordinary refers to the ordinal numbers of each Sunday as we count the weeks between the Church's seasons. Ordinary time can be understood in terms of living out the Christian faith and the significance of Christ's resurrection in our daily lives. The color green represents the life and growth of the church and its ministry.
