The season of Ordinary Time refers to the Sundays of the year that fall outside the periods of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. The word Ordinary refers to the ordinal numbers of each Sunday as we count the weeks between the Church's seasons. Ordinary time can be understood in terms of the living out of the Christian faith and the meaning of Christ's resurrection in our day-to-day life. The color green represents the life and growth of the church and its ministry.

Cover art is *Asleep in the Desert Where he had Withdrawn to Wait for Death, Elijah is Awakened and Comforted by an Angel*, by Marc Chagall. Etching on paper, 1956. Chagall was a Russian-French artist of Belarusian Jewish origin. He created works in virtually every artistic format including painting, book illustrations, stained glass, stage sets, ceramic, tapestries and fine art prints. While recognized by critics as "the quintessential Jewish artist of the twentieth century", Chagall saw his work as "not the dream of one people but of all humanity."
